1945, Raising the Flag on Iwo Jima. Taken by Joe Rosenthal, the photograph shows US Marines raising the flag on top of Mount Suribachi, the island of Iwo Jima during the final stages of the Pacific War.



1974 Burst of Joy. This Pulitzer prize winning picture was taken by photographer Salva Veder of Col. Robert Stirm returning home to his family who runs to welcome him after being released from a prisoner camp in Northern Vietnam.



1958, Faith and Confidence. The Pulitzer prize winning photograph taken by William C. Beall, shows police officer Maurice Cullinane and two-year-old Allen Weaver having a conversation during a parade in Chinatown, Washington DC.



Lunch atop a Skyscraper, 1932. Taken by Charles C Ebbets, the photograph shows construction workers taking a break for lunch on the 69th floor of Rockefeller Center in New York City which was the tallest building in the world at that time



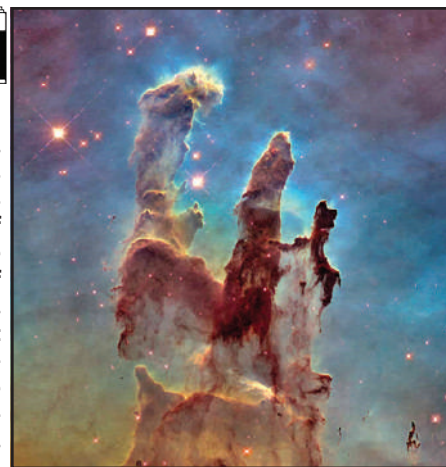
1968, Earthrise from Apollo 8. On December 24, the crew of Apollo 8 became the first humans to leave Earth's orbit and venture into space. As they orbited the moon, they took turns taking pictures of the lunar surface. However, it was when they turned their cameras towards Earth that they captured one of the most famous photographs of all time. The photograph, which came to be known as "Earthrise," shows our planet rising above the moon's horizon.



The London Milkman, 1940. Photographed by Fred Morley on October 9, 1940 shows a milkman making his delivery along a street with buildings destroyed by German bombers during World War II.



1995, Pillars of Creation. Captured by NASA's Hubble Telescope shows three massive pillars of gas and dust amid the surrounding light of young stars nearby. This was one of the first pictures by the telescope that captured the mystery and the wonders of outer space.
